

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The Voice of My Tears

Tears flow incessantly as the guitarist strums the melody of my heart's song. The lyrical phrasing of the Psalm accompanied by the drums and keys somehow enhances my understanding and appreciation of the words penned by David, the worshipping king. Sharing in the commonality of this experience, the stranger next to me extends her hand toward me offering a Kleenex to stop the flow. Extending my hand to grab it, I quickly glance at her face to offer a nod of gratitude, but as I look up, this stranger I now see as kindred spirit as I notice a single tear making its way toward the base of her chin. United by this common experience, without words, we connect in ways that can only be described as transcendental.

In the presence of such an awe-inspiring God, there are few things one finds appropriate in His presence. Humbled by His excellent greatness, some bow in reverence, others lift their hands in surrender, while others simple fall silent. But a greater majority of us simply cry shedding tears not always understood by those around us and some times even we have a hard time understanding the fullness of this expression. Overwhelmed by His omnipotence, in awe of His majesty, involuntarily our eyes overflow with gratitude as His glory surrounds and overtakes us.

Whether in joy or sorrow, pleasure or pain, tears are expressions of the inner yearnings of our soul, the outer hurts of our physical being, and the fulfillment our heart's longing. At times misunderstood, oft times empathized, tears are the vehicle through which we express (voluntarily or against our will) the highlights and lowest points of our lives. Stories of grief, happiness, contentment, satisfaction, and sadness are all told through this powerful expression of humanity; however, the interpretation of each story varies dramatically based on the vantage point.

It is unfortunate for those of us who has ascribed to the belief that our tears weaken us. In fact, tears are your body's release valve for stress, sadness, grief, anxiety and frustration. Emotional tears have special health benefits. Biochemist and "tear expert" Dr. William Frey at the Ramsey Medical Center in Minneapolis, discovered that reflex tears are 98 percent water, whereas emotional tears contain stress hormones which get excreted from the body through crying. After studying the composition of tears, Dr. Frey found that emotional tears shed these hormones and other toxins, which accumulate during stress. Additional studies also suggest that crying stimulates the production of endorphins, our body's natural pain killer and "feel-good" hormones. We forget in our "greatness" that we are beings perfectly created by God who has equipped our bodies with all the tools necessary for our survival.

The Bible speaks clearly and lets us know that God is not offended by our tears. On the contrary, God has a plan even for our tears. Psalm 56:8, "You have taken account of my wanderings; Put my tears in Your bottle. Are they not in Your book?" NASB (Refer to Malachi 3:16). David comforts himself, in his distress and fear, that God noticed all his grievances and all his griefs. God has a bottle and a book for the tears of His people, both the tears for their sins, and those for their afflictions. He observes them with tender concern. Every true believer may boldly say, The Lord is my helper, I will not fear what man shall do unto me; for man has no power but what is given him from above.

Tears of thankfulness are not foreign to the humble believer. The one who recognizes his dependency on God refuses to become so haughty in his spirit that he would rather uphold his own image or his own reputation rather than giving God true thankfulness from the depths of his soul. Luke 7 tells the story of a woman (Mary) who understood what it was like to be overwhelmed with gratitude. Luke records in verses 37-38, a woman in that town who lived a sinful life learned that Jesus was eating at the Pharisee's house, so she came with an alabaster jar of perfume. As she stood behind him at his feet weeping, she began to wet his feet with her tears. Then she wiped



them with her hair, kissed them, and poured perfume on them (NIV). This woman understood what it meant to be in the presence of such a great and awesome God. As she stood before Jesus, the son of God, she knew that all she had to offer was her best. Not only the best of her wealth (the alabaster box), but also the best of her being (expressed through her tears). Make no mistake about it, tears flow from thankful hearts.

Jeremiah speaks in the 31st chapter of tears of joy streaming down our faces. Joy is the intrinsic state of bliss that differs from happiness in that it is not necessarily contingent on outside events, possessions,

or rewards; rather, it is based on the contentment one has regardless of personal circumstance or situation. After being reunited with his brothers in Egypt, the Book of Genesis records in chapter 45 the joyous display of Joseph who kissed his brothers and wept over them. These are the same tears displayed at the birth of a baby, marriage ceremony, or a loved one's graduation. Tears flow from joyful hearts.

At the tomb of Lazarus in John 11:35, we see Jesus, full of compassion, wept openly before the people. And then in Luke 19:41, Jesus sheds tears over the state of Jerusalem. If Jesus, the son of God, filled with all wisdom and all truth, and being the expressed image of God cries as a result of his compassion, then we too should emulate the characteristics of our Lord and recognize the needs, concerns, and plight of others and be moved to tears by what we see and feel. Tears flow from compassionate hearts.

In no way am I advocating emotional instability or a lack of self-control, but to believe that our tears somehow weaken us is not only emotionally unhealthy, it is also unscriptural. And remember, people may not understand, but God always does. Every tear you cry, He gives voice to them and answers your liquid prayer.

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Good Word



David was the second king of Israel according to the Hebrew Bible. He is depicted as a righteous king, although not without fault, as well as an acclaimed warrior, musician and poet, traditionally credited for composing many of the psalms contained in the Book of Psalms.

King David was also significant because he is part of the lineage of the Messiah, Jesus Christ. Christ is, in fact, referred to as the "Son of David." King David was also one of the few Bible characters who made it into the "Hall of Faith" in Hebrews 11.

Character(s): Major: David; Minor: His brothers, Saul

Scriptures: The Books of Samuel, 1 Kings, and 1 Chronicles

Significance of Name: David means beloved.

Best Known For:

God withdraws his favor from Saul, king of Israel. The prophet Samuel seeks a new king from the sons of Jesse of Bethlehem. Seven of Jesse's sons pass before Samuel, but Samuel says, "The Lord has not chosen these." He then asks, "Are these all the sons you have?" and Jesse answers, "There is still the youngest but he is tending the sheep." David is brought to Samuel, and the Lord said, "Rise and anoint him; he is the one."

God sends an evil spirit to torment Saul and his attendants suggest he send for David, a young warrior famed for his bravery and for his skill with the harp. Saul does so and makes David one of his armor-bearers and "whenever the spirit from God came upon Saul, David would take his harp and play. Then relief would come to Saul; he would feel better, and the evil spirit would leave him."

Why is praise important to God? What is worship?

Reader that is an excellent question. Let me first ask you, why do YOU like praise? Why do we as humans have a need to be affirmed? It's part of our nature to know that when we did something well, others were pleased with it. Praise boosts our self esteem, it acknowledges who we are, as well as our positive attributes and contributions. At the end of a performance or speech, applause, "bravos" or the kind words of waiting guests tell us how appreciated our work was. If we as humans who are fallible, make mistakes and are capricious desire praise, then what more would God?

Merriam-Webster Dictionary defines praise as "to express approval of, commend; to glorify (as in divinity)..." Dictionary.com goes even further to describe praise as "the act of expressing approval or admiration; commendation; laudation; the offering of grateful homage in words or song, as an act of worship; the state of being approved or admired..." Praise is a willful act on our part. It's something we choose to give to those we deem worthy of it. So we as humans desire praise, animals even crave it, and we as humans have the ability to give it.

Praise to God needs to be thought about slightly differently. God desires praise, even more so, He is the only one truly worthy of praise. He is the creator of heaven and earth; this life is about Him. We're just along for the ride, reaping the benefits. Throughout the Word of God, we are commanded and urged to praise God, "sing forth the honour of his name: make His praise glorious." (Psalm 66:2) Enter into his gates with thanksgiving, and into his courts with praise: be thankful unto him, and bless his name" (Psalm 100.4, KJV). Simply stated, we are created to praise Him; there isn't a more theological answer to it than that "let every thing that hath breath praise the Lord. Praise ve the Lord" (Psalm 150:6, KJV).

Worship connotes a deeper understanding of who God is and a relationship that reflects that respect for all that He is, and does, "And I saw another angel...saying with a loud voice, Fear God, and give glory to him; for the hour of his judgment is come: and worship him that made heaven and earth, and the sea, and the fountains of waters" (Rev. 14:6-7, KJV).

Worship as something you give, a noun is defined as, "worthiness, respect, reverence paid to a divine being, extravagant respect, admiration or devotion." As a verb, the act that we do, worship is defined as, "to honor or reverence as a divine being or supernatural power" (The Merriam-Webster Dictionary). The Word of God reads, "O come, let us worship and bow down: let us kneel before the Lord our maker" (Psalm 95:6).

The list of scriptures can go on and on that encourage and command us to praise God. Only the ignorant or arrogant keep their praise from God. When you recognize who God is, your praise and worship become automatic and consistent. www.TMATT.org

David tells Saul he is prepared to face Goliath and Saul allows him to make the attempt. He is victorious, striking Goliath in the forehead with a stone from his sling, and the Philistines flee in terror.

Saul makes David a commander over his armies and offers him his daughter Michal in marriage for bringing more than 200 foreskins of the Philistines to him. David is successful in many battles, and his popularity awakes Saul's fears — "What more can he have but the kingdom?" By various stratagems the jealous king seeks his death, but the plots only endear David the more to the people, and especially to Saul's son Jonathan, who loves David. Saul and Jonathan are killed by the Philistines at Mount Gilboa. David mourns their death, then goes up to Hebron, where he is anointed king over Judah.

David commits adultery with Bathsheba, the wife of Uriah the Hittite. Bathsheba becomes pregnant and David sends for Uriah, who is with the Israelite army. David sends him back to Joab, the commander, with a message instructing him to abandon Uriah on the battlefield, "that he may be struck down, and die." David marries Bathsheba and she bears his child, "but the thing that David had done displeased the Lord. The prophet Nathan confronts David, saying: "Why have you despised the word of God, to do what is evil in his sight?" David repents, yet God struck the child and it became sick and dies.

When David has become old and bedridden, Adonijah, his eldest surviving son and natural heir, declares himself king. The plans of Adonijah collapse, and Solomon becomes king (Bathsheba's son). It is to Solomon that David gives his final instructions, including his promise that the line of Solomon and David will inherit the throne of Judah forever. David dies and is buried in the City of David, having ruled forty years over Israel. (Wikipedia)

MORRIS: So what was this experience like of planning what you believed was too much for you?

KIMBERLY: Well, the Lord gave me the vision. But so many people weren't communicating or registering. I didn't know who was coming, but what I like about God in me is that He never let me give up. I still ordered the bags and ordered them big. I still ordered tons of calendars, and I was planning for these large numbers because I knew that if I would just have a little bit of faith, then he would give me the favor. But just gearing up for the day was a hard process. But it was definitely God ordained, and the whole weekend was wonderful from Friday night to Saturday night. And I can't wait to do it again, the right way. This time I'm starting early.

MORRIS: Where do you believe God is taking this ministry?

KIMBERLY: Well, I see out of obedience, God's favor, and I see I'm definitely going to keep moving ahead. Faith and Favor 2011 will be November 11 and 12, location to be determined. But what I see is bigger than what I can see, and I see that God is showing me that local ministry is great and we need a covering, but he's also shown me that obedience is better than sacrifice. So I do see the Faith and Favor conference traveling. I don't see it is as a local New York thing alone. I don't know where it is traveling, but I do see it traveling! God's favor is on us!

MORRIS: Well, thank you for consenting to do this, and we're definitely looking for great things coming from you in the coming years.

But in the midst of all of that, I've been able to stand still and see the Lord work, so I'm yet encouraged.

And I want to say I see now where the Lord was taking and has taken my dad because although my family has always been close in the fact that we don't have like spats and disagreements as some families, but I've prayed for years that my dad would come to church and serve God fully. So the fact that I see him, now we're going on 17 weeks strong, worshipping with me has been a miracle!

MORRIS: What's interesting is that with the experience with yourself, with your dad, and with your mom all dealing with physical infirmities, in the midst of that, you had a Faith and Favor conference where the overall theme was God Still Heals.

First of all, let's just let our readers know what this Faith and Favor ministry is all about.

KIMBERLY: The Faith and Favor

ministry was birthed from the Lord in December of 2006; it came from a vision the Lord gave me. It was mid-December and he woke me up in the middle of the night and I began to write the vision and make it plain. But when He gave it to me, He gave it to me large, huge, and I was very hesitant and very resistant. I guess you would just say disobedient. I didn't believe it. So I did speak to my church leadership about it, but I downplayed the vision far too much. And I've learned that through this process, to just do what He says and not what you want. Because what we want doesn't matter, but His will must be done.

So the purpose of Faith and Favor ministries is to reach the heart of people, regardless! People in our own communities are hurting and failing, and we're failing each other. So the whole goal is that people would understand if they have faith, then God would grant the favor; we've got to believe.



LOW BLOOD PRESSURE (HYPOTENSION)

What is low blood pressure?

Low blood pressure is when the pressure becomes low and causes the blood flow to become low as well through the arties and veins. When the flow of blood becomes low, the oxygen and nutrients in the brain, heart and the kidneys are affected and do not function properly. Low blood pressure can cause temporary or permanent damage to these vital organs. If low blood pressure causes clinical symptoms, the cause will be in one of three general categories: either the heart is not pumping with enough pressure, the artery walls are too dilated, or there is not enough intravascular fluid within the system.

- Signs and Symptoms
- Lightheaded
- Dizzy or weak
- Faint
- Chest pain (angina)
- Heart attack

The symptoms will depend upon which organ in the body is lacking adequate blood flow.

Diagnosis

Diagnosing low blood pressure in individuals is usually during a routine visit or a sick visit; where the seemly healthy individual discloses his/her signs of weakness, dizziness and feeling faint. This usually leads to suspicion of low blood pressure. Simply measuring the pressure in the lying or standing position is the first step in the diagnosis process. Some tests include:

- CBC (complete blood count)
- Blood and urine cultures
- Blood electrolytes measurements
- Radiology studies
- Electrocardiograms (EKG)

Treatment

An individual with no symptoms will require no intervention. However, an individual with symptoms will have to undergo treatment and it is usually combined with diagnosis. Treatment can be as simple as lowering the dosage of medication an individual is taking. Another individual may need a more aggressive treatment plan such as: intravenous fluids, oxygen, antibiotics, antihistamine and/or blood transfusion.

MORRIS: We're here with Kimberly Crawford, who is the founder of Faith and Favor Ministries. I'm excited for her being here with us. She's up really early this morning just to get this done for us, so I appreciate what it is that she's doing. Why don't you go ahead and introduce yourself to our readers?

KIMBERLY: My pleasure. I am Lady Kimberly Crawford. I'm from Westchester, NY. But simply, I am a young woman who desires the will of the Lord, finally! And it's important that you quote that. And at this point in my life, I'm going through a stretching process or a journey as we would call it,

and I'm just trusting God for the impossible and the unbelievable. So he's definitely enlarging my faith and enlarging my territory.

MORRIS: One of the things that we wanted to talk about is what you are journeying on right now, and I know that part of that is seminary. Let our readers know what school you're going to and what prompted you to pursue this.

KIMBERLY: Okay. Well, my daytime job is that I'm an educator. I work as a testing coordinator in the City of New York. We work with Albany, so I coordinate those tests and I oversee the auditing and the grading of the tests. That's my daytime job, but my first love is to be a kindergarten teacher. That's how I started. I was a teacher for several years. I did go on to school and I graduated in 2007 with a principal's license. And at this point, I'm not operating in that capacity, but who knows, maybe one day soon.

Currently, I'm enrolled in New York Theological Seminary. I've always wanted to go to seminary, but was intimidated because it's a 90 credit degree program. But the Lord sent me there to that seminary in January of 2010, and it's interesting because my car literally drove there. I wasn't planning on going there.

I thought about it. I was trying to get some information. I had spoken to another one of my friends about it, but that particular day, I made a

certain left instead of driving straight to go home, and I ended up there. And they interviewed me and they accepted me on the spot. So God is moving.

It is a very hard experience though. Last semester was good because I took a Preaching and Worship class. That was different. I won't say it was easy, but that it was an easier flow. This semester has been challenging because the work is different; the content is different. My passion for the subject is different. But it's a good experience.

MORRIS: Along with the challenges of seminary, I know that some of your challenges also have been personal. You've had a number of things going on in your family life and even in your own personal life as it relates to overall health.

KIMBERLY: Well, this has indeed been a long year, and that's one of the reasons why I was so interested in just supporting the newsletter and having the interview because sometimes you've got to push past your pain. I'm still in my 30's, but this has been the hardest year that I can recall



in my life. Just yesterday when we were trying to meet was the one year anniversary of me getting sick and I was up early in the morning in the kitchen cooking dinner for my mom because she hasn't been feeling well when I began reflecting on all of this. So it has been the hardest year emotionally, physically and spiritually. Some of the things that were closest to me this year were removed, either through death, through separation, through situations. I have a cervical spine injury that is pretty severe, but the Lord is blessing, and it has allowed me to be limited in what I carry, what I lift up, where I go and what I can move, so it's been a challenge. That happened in November 2009. Two weeks after that, I lost some close people in my life and then one week after that. I lost another person, so it's been a long journey. And then six months after that, I found out that my father had five heart attacks and he was hospitalized, and they called me (the hospital) because they had to call the next of kin. Five months after that, I found out that my mother is very ill and she's hospitalized today.
