

Pause too long and your ability to move forward just might be hampered.

Stop

The stop button is one of the most dangerous buttons of all in that the actual device stops working as hard when it's pressed. On a CD player or DVD player, the disc spins in all modes except when the stop button is pressed. On a VCR, the television's regular program comes back on when the stop button is pressed. Much like the stop key on these devices, when our stop button is pressed, we too are unable to move forward. We lose our capabilities... our ability to function. Like a muscle that is out of use, we become weak and out of shape.

Fast Forward

There are many who have held down the fast forward button of life. Instead of waiting on God, we decide to take matters into our own hands. Instead of trusting that whatever our situation may be, He will work it out; we decide



to try to work it out ourselves. Philippians 4:6 says Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be known to God.

But the word wait is a verb, which means that it is a word of action. Most of us are not sure what to do while we wait, which is why we become so anxious. But your time of waiting should be your time of prayer... it should be a time of fasting... It should be a pe-

riod of communion with God and thanksgiving to God for what He has AL-READY done, and what you KNOW He will do.

Record

One of the buttons I find most interesting is the record button. On most devices, it is the only button that has a color to denote its function. The record button is always in red, warning us, so that we do not copy over something unintentionally. Unfortunately, in the church, we see much of this. We have lost our identity because we have copied the patterns of the world.

Colossians 2:8 says, "Beware lest any man spoil you through philosophy and vain deceit, after the tradition of men, after the rudiments of the world, and not after Christ. It is unfortunate that the things that are wrong, we now call right; and the things that were right, we now call wrong. We have recorded over our identity and taken on the image and ideals of the world.

But the interesting thing about the record button is that it's not completely a wrong thing. Paul says in I Corinthians 11:1 Be followers of me, even as I am of Christ. We are to surround ourselves with Godly examples and duplicate the patterns we see. This is not to say that we should all be carbon copies of one another, but there is a pattern of holiness that all of our lives should exemplify as children of God. Record is great for inspiration and motivation, but there still can only be one Master Copy.

Rewind

Many of us can't resist hitting the rewind button of life. Instead of forgetting the things of the past, as the scriptures tell us, we return to the former things of old. God delivers us from circumstances and situations and instead of rejoicing in that deliverance, we decide the coast is clear, and that it's safe for us to go back to Egypt.

Many of us have forfeited our rights as children of the Most High God. We've been so concerned about the things of the past that we have missed opportunities that God has placed before us. The past has become our cause of paralysis as it relates to our success simply because we were not willing to let it go and trust in the promises of God.

Play

But with all of the options we have in life, the greatest button of all is the play button. The pace and timing is just as the creator intended. I press toward the mark for the prize of the high calling of God in Christ Jesus. The dictionary defines press as a steady weight or force against something. It's not a rushed process... It's the necessary effort needed to get the desired result.

Which button will you choose?

It is like the precious ointment upon the beard, even Aaron's beard: that went down to the skirts of his garments; As the dew of the Hermon, and as the dew that descended upon the mountains of Zion: for there the Lord commanded the blessing, even life evermore." There is a blessing from God when you gather together with brothers and sisters in Christ. There is unity in numbers and strength as well as the overflow of the anointing in the corporate presence of God.

Ecclesiastes 4:9-10 states, "Two are better than one; because they have a good reward for their labour. For if they fall, the one will lift up his fellow: but woe to him that is alone when he falleth; for he hath not another to help him up." We have to view fellowship (going to church) as an opportunity to uplift each other and not as a way to be pulled down. I encourage you reader to change your thinking. View the house of God as an opportunity to draw strength, to encourage your fellow brothers and sisters in Christ. Remember when your focus is on God, your expectation and experience in the house of God is one of being uplifted and strengthened.

Romans 10:14 reads, "How then shall they call on him in whom they have not believed? and how shall they believe in him of whom they have not heard? and how shall they hear without a preacher?" The Lord knows that satan is crafty and there are many false and seducing doctrines and spirits. There is another place in the word where the Lord says, if it would be so the very elect of God would be seduced (paraphrased). Going to church is not just about the people, it's also about hearing the word of God from the leader of God. How can you hear, or in other words get that greater revelation except there be a preacher; how do you hear the preacher unless you go to church?

Reader, I would say that your growth in Christ is connected both to your individual worship time and your corporate worship time.

If you have not accepted Christ in your life as personal Lord and Savior, we encourage you to do it now. Just simply say this prayer, "Lord, I am a sinner and I want you to come into my life. I believe that Jesus is your only begotten Son, and that He died to save me from sin. I repent of my sins and ask you to forgive me. Thank you for loving and saving me."

Can you reach the same spiritual level worshiping at home as worshiping in a church? In church, you're influenced by others and their spiritual burdens.

This Christian walk and our spiritual growth is in both a vertical and horizontal direction. Some may say that was the purpose of the style of the cross. There is a difference in allowing the spirits, attitudes or burdens of others influence you because you have made the people your focus versus attending church with various people who may have issues, but your focus is on the God who can deliver you.

Psalm 133 is made up of 3 verses that highlight the importance of dwelling together in unity, coming together as a congregation (or in laymen's terms as a church) and worshiping. "Behold, how good and pleasant it is for brethen to dwell together in unity!

a difference in the world through the Kingdom or as a representative of the Kingdom. Let's really exhaust the will of God for our lives while we are here... let's be all that we can be. Let's enjoy life. Let's live. Enjoy the opportunity that God has given me to live life.

I really want to preach to the body of Christ that God has more for us, and the more does not just mean church. Very quickly, I tell young people all the time I believe God has an anointing and anointing and not just to preach, sing, play or direct a choir. Even if you have to come back home, at least you can say, "I tried." It's okay to try something different at any age, at any junction in life. God, I just believe, can really show us there's something more to us and don't be afraid, try it. You know, try to go out there, build up the strength and build up the courage. Most of all, sit down, pray, and write out a plan.

Even in church, we tend to place unnecessary limits. What we aspire for (to me) is so minimal compared to the vastness and the greatness of God. We aspire to be auxiliary heads, preachers, pastors; I know that those things are in my future. However, I want to make

MULTIPLE MYELOMA

Multiple Myeloma is a cancer of one's plasma cells, a type of white blood cell present in an individual's bone marrow. It's the most common type of plasma cell cancer and it's a disease that is seldom cured. Plasma cells are part of one's immune system, which helps protect the body from germs and other harmful substances. Plasma cells make proteins that are called antibodies, which aid to fight off infections. In multiple myeloma, a group of abnormal plasma cells (myeloma cells) multiplies, raising the number of plasma cells to a higher than normal level. Since these cells normally make proteins, the level of abnormal proteins in your blood also may go up. In time, myeloma cells collects in the bone marrow and in the solid parts of bone. When myeloma cells collect in several parts of the bone, it is called multiple myeloma.

Risk Factors/Causes

Physicians are unsure about the exact cause of the disease. They cannot pinpoint why some individuals get the disease and some do not. What doctors are certain about is myeloma is not a contagious disease, it cannot be spread from one individual to the next. Causes and risk factors are:

- Over age 65
- Race
- Being a man
- · Family history of multiple myeloma

Symptoms

- Bone pain, often in the back or ribs
- Broken bones
- · Weakness or fatigue
- · Weight loss
- · Repeated infections
- Frequent urination
- Nausea or constipation
- Fever

Most often, these symptoms are not due to cancer. Other health problems may also cause these symptoms. Only a doctor can tell for sure.

Treatment

Individuals who have been diagnosed with multiple myeloma have several treatment options. The choice of treatment depends mainly on how advanced the disease is and whether the individual has symptoms. Treatment options are watchful waiting, induction therapy, and stem cell transplant. If individuals are without symptoms, doctors usually do not begin treatment right away; they wait and monitor the health of the individual (watchful waiting). Individuals with symptoms usually have induction therapy or stem cell therapy.

MORRIS: Hey all! I'm sitting with the man himself, Elder Damon Mack of the Allen Memorial COGIC in Mt. Vernon, NY and he's ready y'all! He's got some great perspectives to share with the body and also some exciting happenings in his personal life. Welcome, Elder Damon. Tell our readers a little about yourself.

DAMON: Well, I'm a little short guy from Mount Vernon, New York... I was born and raised here all my life. I've been in church all my life. I'm a third-generation preacher. My grandfather pastors and my biological father is a minister. My spiritual and adoptive father is a pastor (Pastor Carlton Spruill) and my

grandfather is Bishop Ray Blake from White Plains Deliverance. I had ups and downs like everybody else, but I'm here.

I've been in music ministry now about 25 years. Currently, I'm the Director of Music at Allen Memorial COGIC (Mt. Vernon, NY). I've been here in that position the last six years. I also work at the Abyssinian Baptist Church with Reverend Calvin Butts. I'm an ordained elder. I've been preaching now about six years. And I've been blessed to do some traveling, and actually I'm embarking on... as an extension of Allen Memorial Church, my own Evangelistic Ministries, Damon Mack Ministries.

MORRIS: You talked about growing up in the church, and with 3 generations of preachers; we can say you were birthed in the church. How has growing up in the church influenced you positively and negatively (because we know it's never just going to be all good)?

DAMON: Well, I'll start with the negative... Growing up in church all my life had a negative affect because it closed my world views. I grew up in one culture and it wasn't until later on in life that I realized that there was really a world that it was okay to live in outside of "no pants," "no movies"...not being diverse. So really I've just come within the last 5 to 6 years of life experiencing just another culture... being around a lot black men and women that love God

and are world cultured.

Positively, it still kept me rooted. So even at times when I tried to get out there and do my own thing (and there was plenty of times), there was something already planted in me and it caught me and kept me grounded until I was able to mature into knowing how to have a relationship with Christ.

MORRIS: Let's talk about the music ministry. You are the minister of music at Allen (AMCOGIC), but you also are doing some things separately from that.

DAMON: Well we (Allen Memorial) just released our new project, "Deliberate Praise, Volume One" - Allen Memorial Music and Arts Ministry... so go and get it. Come to the church and get a copy or go to I-Tunes (cheap plug) LOL.

My baby is "Chosen" [his music group] and we've been on a hiatus because of the ministry and my workload, but we're coming back together to do



something really special this year.

I am actually currently exploring some plays and some other opportunities. I'm looking to get to do some off-Broadway.
